



Sunday, November 26: We leave Miami and head to Cairo

Monday, November 27: Arrival Cairo

We come to the land of the Pharaohs, as Joseph came as a slave and Israel during the famine. Upon arrival in Cairo we will meet our guide and driver who will transport us to the hotel for dinner and rest for the rest of the night. We will relax tonight as we prepare for the adventure trip ahead.

Tuesday, November 28: Cairo: Pyramids and Treasures of Tutankhamun

We start our visit today with some views of ancient Egypt - some of which date back to 1000 years before Abraham. Keops, with an original height of 496 feet, is the most colossal pyramid ever built. Today we will also see the Sphinx and tour the Egyptian Museum, the location of the treasures of Tutankhamun and ancient remains. Dinner on the Nile River on a Boat with Folk Show

Wednesday, November 29: Memphis, Sakkara, Joseph's Warehouses

We will enjoy a short trip to Memphis. Founded around 3100 BC, Memphis is the legendary city of Menes, the king who united the Upper and Lower Egypt. From a biblical perspective, Memphis is most likely where Abraham lied to Pharaoh that his wife Sarah was his sister and where Joseph served as second in command. While in Memphis we are going to see a very large and well preserved statue of Ramses II. Next is Sakkara, which is one of the largest archaeological sites in Egypt! Sakkara is dominated by the stepped pyramid of King Zoser, dating from 2700 BC. It is one of the oldest stone structures in the world! Fayum, the region created by the divinely inspired wisdom of Joseph. Here you will find old warehouses and an artificial lake created by a canal, whose construction was ordered by Jose. It was this lake that provides irrigation for desert land, and supplies the necessary food to survive its prophesied famine seven years

Thursday, November 30: Cairo / Amman / Petra

After breakfast, transfer to Cairo airport for your flight to Amman. Arrival in Amman and transfer to Petra. Dinner and accommodation

Friday, December 1: Petra

After breakfast we will visit the impressive mountain fortress of Petra, known for being inhabited by the Edomites - the descendants of Esau. Start the tour with a walk through the "Siq", an immense crack in the Nabatean sandstone, to the city of Petra carved in the pink red rock. The Treasure, El Khazneh, is one of the most elegant remains of antiquity. Beyond El Khazneh we are surrounded on both sides by hundreds of carved and constructed structures of Petra. Departing Petra, we travel north along the "Camino Real" where to the west we see the hills that border the Dead Sea. This is the hill / palace area of Maqueronte, where Juan El Bautista was beheaded. Overnight in Amman

Saturday, December 2: Amman - Mount Nebo - Jerash - Sheik Hussein Border - Tiberias

Breakfast.- Then we will leave in the direction of Mount Nebo, a legendary place where God showed Moses the Promised Land, after 40 years of pilgrimage through the desert and crossing the Red Sea. The view over the Jordan Valley, the Dead Sea, the Judean desert, and the town of Jericho is breathtaking. Then we will visit Mádaba, where the mosaics found with the map of the Holy Land will be visited. Baptism of Jesus, we will see the Jordan River continued Jeraza, city of the Decapolis. - Visit of the remains of the ancient Roman city with its streets adorned with columns, theater, baths located at the top of the hill and the Arc de Triomphe. - finally visit the place of the baptism of Jesus in Betabara, we will go to Galilee. Then cross the Jordan crossing the bridge of Shiek Hussein. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias

Sunday, December 3: The Ministry of Jesus

Today for lunch will enjoy Pedro's fish on the lake.

After an early breakfast, we will start our day with a boat trip on the Sea of Galilee, where we will visit Kibbutz Ginossar where they have a boat that dates from the time of Jesus. From there we continue to Capernaum, the center of the Ministry of Jesus in the Galilee and site of many of his miracles (Mark 2: 4, Matthew 8: 5, 14-17, 9: 1-7, 17:18). We will see the remnants of the house of Peter and the site of the synagogue where Jesus taught and worshiped God (Mark 1:21, Luke 4:31). We will make a brief visit to Yardenit to get an idea of what the Jordan was like in biblical times. After dinner you can take a walk on the shores of the Sea of Galilee. We will stop briefly in other cities related to the ministry of Jesus Magdal, Corazin, Bethsaida (possible visit) and Cursi. This after having briefly stopped the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus gave what is perhaps his most famous and forever preached sermon "The Sermon on the Mount" (Matthew 5, 6 and 7) We will drive to the Golan Heights and visit Baniyas, one of the fountains of the Jordan River and site of the ancient Caesarea of Philippi, where Peter confessed his faith in Christ (Matthew 16:16 Dinner and Accommodation in Tiberias

Monday, December 4: Cesarean / Galilee

Our first stop will be Cesarea Maritima, built by Herod the Great. That was the capital of the province of Judea (not Jerusalem) during the time when Jesus of Nazareth lived. There Pontius Pilate governed when he went to judge Jesus in Jerusalem. In this city Cornelius was baptized and lived (Acts 10). From this city Paul embarked at Tarsus (Acts 9:30) and Philip preached (Acts 8:40). We follow Megiddo, one of the fortified cities of King Solomon (I Kings 9:15; 10:26) in which there are ruins of more than 20 levels of civilization. In this place the books and revelations of Daniel will come to life as we read about the final battle of Amargedon, with the Jezreel plains ahead of us. We will continue along the pastoral hills of the Galilee. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias

Tuesday, December 5: Nazareth, Beit Shean, Jerusalem

After breakfast we will leave Galilee and depart for Nazareth, city of the adolescence of Jesus where we will visit the Villa of Nazareth. We will proceed to Beit Shean and walk through the largest and most incredible excavations in Israel, with its amphitheater, Roman columns, mosaics and Roman baths. This is also the city where the bodies of King Saul and his sons were nailed to the walls (Samuel I 31:10). Arriving in Jerusalem, we will enter through the gate of Stephen to visit the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed a paralyzed man (John 5). Then we have to cross parts of the Via Dolorosa. Dinner and

overnight in Jerusalem.

Wednesday, December 6: Jerusalem Old City

We start with a panoramic view of the city, Mount Moriah and the Dome of the Rock from the Mount of Olives; We continue to the Garden of Gethsemane, and have time to meditate. We will walk along the Torrente del Cedron and will pass near the Golden Gate. We will visit Mount Zion to visit the House of Caiphas the Priest, where they interrogated Jesus the night that Judas betrayed him (Mark 14: 53-65). We will also visit the tomb of King David and the Cenacle, where Jesus had his Last Supper before being arrested. We conclude at the Garden Tomb for a Holy Supper and short Saturday service. In the evening, you can see the David Citadel show (not included) or are free to shop.

Thursday, December 7: Jerusalem

We will visit the City of David in Siloam and pass through the tunnel of Hezekiah. After breakfast we will visit the city of David, we will see the Canaanite ruins and constructions made by the Hebrews during the Iron Age. We will descend through the ancient aqueduct system and will pass through the tunnel built by King Hezekiah. It is exciting to go through this marvel of ancestral engineering. We ended up in the pond of Siloe where Jesus healed the blind according to John 9. We will then enter the old city through the Garbage Gate to visit the Davidson Center for a better understanding of the Temple period. We will visit the South Stairs and the incredible excavations. We will see the ruins and the Robinson Arch. After lunch we will visit the Jewish Quarter and the Cardo of the Old City. We will pass the Western Wall to visit the Hasmonean tunnel. Dinner and accommodation.

Friday, December 8: Jerusalem: Massada / Dead Sea / Qumram

After an early breakfast we will drive to Jericho, the oldest inhabited city in the world and first city conquered by Joshua (Joshua 6) after leading the people of Israel to the promised land by the divided waters of the Jordan River (Joshua 3 and 4) . We will go up to the Mount of Temptations by the cable car where Jesus was tempted by the devil after forty days and forty nights of fasting (Matthew 4). We will go to the Dead Sea area, until descending to the lowest point in the world, 1305 feet (398m) below sea level. We will visit Masada, ascend to the top of the fortress by cable car. Our walk among the ruins of this historic place is enhanced by the fantastic view of the Dead Sea. On our journey we will see Ein Gedi and as we travel we will hear the stories of David and his rival, King Saul, mentioned in the book Psalms. We will pass Qumran, where a young man discovered in 1948 the scrolls written by the ancient Jewish sect that lived in the caves of the area in the times of Jesus. Free time to float on the Dead Sea and cover us with mud. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Saturday, December 9: Jerusalem and Bethlehem

Very early in the morning we will visit Mount Moriah where the Temple was. We will go to the Israel Museum where we will see the model of Jerusalem, the Sanctuary Of the Book and visit the vast archaeological collection with the same ticket. Drive to Herodium and Bethlehem to visit the Pastor's Field, the Church of the Nativity and the Crib. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Sunday, December 10: Jerusalem

Return home with eternal memories of the Holy Land. Shalom!
